2025 Missions Report

We believe that encouraging those who are presenting God's Word enables them to thrive.

The mission's ministry of Providence exists to encourage our members to be involved in the Great Commandment (Matthew 22:37-39) and the Great Commission (Matthew 28:19-20) given to us by Jesus. We desire everyone have an opportunity to hear the Gospel and that it is our mandate, to take the message of Jesus Christ to the people of San Angelo, TX, the United States, and across the globe. It is the desire of our church to help every member be involved in missions through: prayer, giving, personal evangelism, and going.

16 WAYS TO PRAY FOR MISSIONARIES

- 1) PRAY THAT THEY WOULD BE CONFIDENT IN GOD'S WORD (ACTS 13:4-5) Missionaries are sent not just to learn culture or do humanitarian relief but to confidently proclaim the Word of God.
- 2) PRAY THAT THEY WOULD BE FILLED WITH GOD'S SPIRIT (ACTS 13:6-9) Believers already have the Holy Spirit in them, but at times the Spirit fills someone in a special way to enable him or her to proclaim God's Word.
- 3) PRAY FOR THEIR VICTORY IN SPIRITUAL WARFARE (ACTS 13:10-12) When our brothers and sisters take the gospel into the nations, they are going into a war. The devil is dead set on destroying souls and diverting mission.
- 4) PRAY FOR THEIR SUCCESS IN GOSPEL WITNESS (ACTS 13:12)
 Pray that many would come to know Christ in all walks of life from the faithful witness of our missionaries.
- 5) PRAY FOR PEACE WITH OTHER BELIEVERS (ACTS 13:13)
 Satan attacks from all angles, both inside and outside. Pray for peace within families, in marriages, with children, and with companions and ministry partners.
- 6) PRAY FOR FAVOR WITH UNBELIEVERS (ACTS 13:14-15)

 Nonbelievers are blind to the gospel, and many are violently opposed to its message. Pray that missionaries would find favorable opportunities to share the gospel with them.
- 7) PRAY THAT THE GOSPEL WILL BE CLEAR THROUGH THEM (ACTS 13:16-47) Although cross-cultural communication is difficult, pray that missionaries, by grace, would clearly communicate the character of God, the sinfulness of man, the sufficiency of Christ, the necessity of faith, and the urgency of eternity.
- 8) PRAY THAT GOD WILL OPEN HEARTS AROUND THEM (ACTS 13:48) God alone draws people to himself. Pray that he will open hearts and minds to believe and be drawn to eternal life with Christ.

16 WAYS TO PRAY FOR MISSIONARIES

- 9) PRAY FOR THEIR JOY IN THE MIDST OF SUFFERING (ACTS 14:1-2)
 - Missionaries often face various forms and levels of suffering in their work. Pray that they would experience the joy of intimacy with Christ in the midst of it
- 10) PRAY FOR THEIR KINDNESS IN THE MIDST OF SLANDER (ACTS 14:1-2)
 Though missionaries face suffering and difficulty, pray that the character of Christ and the power of his Spirit enable them to respond with grace.
- 11) PRAY FOR SUPERNATURAL POWER TO ACCOMPANY THEM (ACTS 14:3)
 Pray that missionaries would speak the Word with boldness and that supernatural power would accompany its proclamation.
- 12) PRAY FOR CHRISTLIKE HUMILITY TO CHARACTERIZE THEM (ACTS 14:4-18) Pray that missionaries would overcome the temptation to be prideful in their work by the power of the Spirit.
- 13) PRAY FOR THEIR PATIENCE (ACTS 14:8-18)
 Missionaries face ups and downs and wins and losses in their work. Pray that they might respond with longsuffering.
- 14) PRAY FOR THEIR PERSEVERANCE (ACTS 14:19-20)
 In 2 Corinthians 4:8-9 Paul wrote, "We are . . . struck down but not destroyed." Pray for missionaries to persevere through setback after setback, beat down after beat down, and struggle after struggle.
- 15) PRAY THAT GOD WOULD USE THEM TO MAKE DISCIPLES (ACTS 14:21-23) Pray that missionaries would see fruit in their ministries as they seek to make disciples among the nations.
- 16) PRAY THAT GOD WOULD USE THEM TO MULTIPLY CHURCHES (ACTS 14:24–28) Pray for the multiplication of churches filled with people who know the Word led by pastors who teach the Word.

Thank you Providence Baptist in San Angelo for your faithful support. We appreciate your interest in us as missionaries and all that God has called us to here in Peru. David continues to direct the Seminario Biblico Bautista de Lima. In 2024, we started a masters degrees in Spiritual Leadership that has the accreditation and backing of Mission University in Springfield, Missouri. Our first cohort is 15 students in the Masters program and 60 students all together. We continue to work with the Editorial Sembrando writing and publishing Sunday School curriculum along with parent and teacher resources that are biblically sound and God centered. Our curriculum has been distributed in 10 countries, and last year we trained 1500 Sunday School teachers. This year we have partnered with CLC (Centros de Literatura Cristiana) A Christian book distributor in South America that will enable our entry into even more South and Central American countries. This August we accepted full responsibility for the Administration of the Nueva Esperanza Camp. We have seen over 3000 campers come through the camp this year and hundreds of people make decisions for Christ. This camp has been self sustaining this year, we have paid a caretaker along with its maintenance and upkeep and are thankful to the Lord for that. We also continue working at the Mayorzgo Church. David is still co-pastor, and continues to teach and Tonya and David counsel on a weekly basis. Our desire is always honor both our supporters and our Lord with our investments of time, energy and resources. You have blessed us with your desire to know us and care of us as your missionaries, Thank you!

Madagascar

Let me start out by thanking you for your investment into the ministry here in Madagascar. As of right now we are about a year and a half into our second church plant. In that year and a half we have seen many saved and baptized and are now trying to take people through discipleship. We have grown quite a bit in the last year. In July and August we had new highs every week with our record high attendance being just shy of 500 people in that service. Because there were people standing outside during the service, in September we went to two Sunday morning services, which gives us more opportunity to grow. We are now starting to have some of those who have been saved and discipled now move into serving rolls at the church.

In August we took the youth from the church to camp for the first time. We saw several students saved and they all came back on fire for the Gospel. Several of the students asked after camp if there was away to get extra teaching during the week, so we started a mid-week worship and Bible study time for our youth that we are calling "Foundry Student Ministry." God has been moving here in a great way, And Providence has fruit to your account in Madagascar. Thank you again!

Spiritual Needs

We are growing fast and trying to keep up, so we need both national and more missionary help as we continue to reach our area in Madagascar.

We deal with a lot of poverty issues. We have a teenaged young lady who was saved at camp. After camp we learned she was pregnant because her mother and grandmother had sold her to a married man for sex. We need prayer on how to walk her through this and what we as missionaries and the church can do to keep her from being abused in the future. One thing we deal with a lot is ancestor worship. It keeps the Malagasy in bondage of fear that only God can free them from. Our church and some of our people have faced persecution since the church started.

CREATIVE ACCESS

"The rulers, elders and teachers of the law called them in again and commanded them not to speak or teach at all in the name of Jesus." (Acts 4:18)

There are countries where it is not possible for an expatriate (or foreign) missionary to get a visa. There are countries where church activities are greatly restricted and some countries where open evangelism by Christians is completely prohibited. Churches in areas where they have to meet in secret are sometimes referred to as Underground Churches. Some people have been tempted to think these countries – many of which have Islamic governments – are unreachable. While fulfilling the Great Commission in those countries can be challenging, it is not impossible. Closed to missionaries does not mean closed to the gospel, and that's where the phrase "creative access" is utilized. The following missionary families serve in Creative Access Nations around the world and so information about them is sensitive.

The HeartCry Missionary Society began in 1988 in the country of Peru with a desire to aid indigenous or native missionaries so that they might reach their peoples and establish biblical churches among them. Since then, the Lord has expanded the borders to include not only Latin America, but also Africa, Asia, Eurasia, Europe, and the Middle East.

The goal of the ministry is to facilitate the advancement of indigenous missionaries throughout the world. The strategy consists of four primary components: financial support, theological training, Scripture and literature distribution, and the supply of any tool necessary to facilitate the completion of the Great Commission.

HeartCry Missionary Society was founded and still exists for the advancement of four major goals:

- The Glory of God
- The Benefit of Man
- The Establishment of Biblical Churches
- The Demonstration of God's Faithfulness

At Living Oaks Counseling we believe that God has given us all we need to know Him and to live in a way that is pleasing to Him. All our difficulties may not evaporate. However, when a person willingly submits to God's instructions and clings to his promises there is hope and help.

We see people with all kinds of problems, but the most common would be those struggling in their marriage, helping parents with their children, those dealing with sexual sin, and those struggling with their emotions (e.g. depression or anger). In all cases, we use the Bible, God's Sufficient Word, to answer the problems of life.

CCEF works to restore Christ to counseling. Each of us has personal and interpersonal struggles. Jesus Christ knows those struggles, cares about struggler's, and enters in. We see him bring about significant change in people's lives every day. This passion for Christ's relevance in counseling is our heritage and heartbeat.

CCEF works to restore counseling to the church. We believe that the body of Christ is God's primary context for change, the community God uses to transform his people. CCEF's mission is to equip the church to be this kind of transforming community. We see ourselves as an extension of the local church, and we want to serve and promote its ministry. 
V. Evangelism
