16 WAYS TO PRAY FOR MISSIONARIES

- 1) PRAY THAT THEY WOULD BE CONFIDENT IN GOD'S WORD (ACTS 13:4-5) Missionaries are sent not just to learn culture or do humanitarian relief but to confidently proclaim the Word of God.
- 2) PRAY THAT THEY WOULD BE FILLED WITH GOD'S SPIRIT (ACTS 13:6-9)
 Believers already have the Holy Spirit in them, but at times the Spirit fills someone in a special way to enable him or her to proclaim God's Word.
- 3) PRAY FOR THEIR VICTORY IN SPIRITUAL WARFARE (ACTS 13:10-12) When our brothers and sisters take the gospel into the nations, they are going into a war. The devil is dead set on destroying souls and diverting mission.
- 4) PRAY FOR THEIR SUCCESS IN GOSPEL WITNESS (ACTS 13:12)
 Pray that many would come to know Christ in all walks of life from the faithful witness of our missionaries.
- 5) PRAY FOR PEACE WITH OTHER BELIEVERS (ACTS 13:13)
 Satan attacks from all angles, both inside and outside. Pray for peace within families, in marriages, with children, and with companions and ministry partners.
- 6) PRAY FOR FAVOR WITH UNBELIEVERS (ACTS 13:14-15)

 Nonbelievers are blind to the gospel, and many are violently opposed to its message. Pray that missionaries would find favorable opportunities to share the gospel with them.
- 7) PRAY THAT THE GOSPEL WILL BE CLEAR THROUGH THEM (ACTS 13:16-47) Although cross-cultural communication is difficult, pray that missionaries, by grace, would clearly communicate the character of God, the sinfulness of man, the sufficiency of Christ, the necessity of faith, and the urgency of eternity.
- 8) PRAY THAT GOD WILL OPEN HEARTS AROUND THEM (ACTS 13:48) God alone draws people to himself. Pray that he will open hearts and minds to believe and be drawn to eternal life with Christ.

16 WAYS TO PRAY FOR MISSIONARIES

- 9) PRAY FOR THEIR JOY IN THE MIDST OF SUFFERING (ACTS 14:1-2)
 - Missionaries often face various forms and levels of suffering in their work. Pray that they would experience the joy of intimacy with Christ in the midst of it
- 10) PRAY FOR THEIR KINDNESS IN THE MIDST OF SLANDER (ACTS 14:1-2)
 Though missionaries face suffering and difficulty, pray that the character of Christ and the power of his Spirit enable them to respond with grace.
- 11) PRAY FOR SUPERNATURAL POWER TO ACCOMPANY THEM (ACTS 14:3)
 Pray that missionaries would speak the Word with boldness and that supernatural power would accompany its proclamation.
- 12) PRAY FOR CHRISTLIKE HUMILITY TO CHARACTERIZE THEM (ACTS 14:4-18) Pray that missionaries would overcome the temptation to be prideful in their work by the power of the Spirit.
- 13) PRAY FOR THEIR PATIENCE (ACTS 14:8-18)
 Missionaries face ups and downs and wins and losses in their work. Pray that they might respond with longsuffering.
- 14) PRAY FOR THEIR PERSEVERANCE (ACTS 14:19-20)
 In 2 Corinthians 4:8-9 Paul wrote, "We are . . . struck down but not destroyed." Pray for missionaries to persevere through setback after setback, beat down after beat down, and struggle after struggle.
- 15) PRAY THAT GOD WOULD USE THEM TO MAKE DISCIPLES (ACTS 14:21-23) Pray that missionaries would see fruit in their ministries as they seek to make disciples among the nations.
- 16) PRAY THAT GOD WOULD USE THEM TO MULTIPLY CHURCHES (ACTS 14:24-28)
 Pray for the multiplication of churches filled with people who know the
 Word led by pastors who teach the Word.






Lifepoint Baptist Church,

Dear Lifepoint Baptist Church,

God has blessed our ministry in Nicaragua and we now have three church plants happening at the same time! Our first church plant in downtown Estelí is doing well. In September, we installed the Nicaraguan Pastor. He and his wife both came to the Lord in our ministry, Jennifer and I have discipled them and now they are in seminary continuing to learn and grow. They have seen dozens of people come to the Lord in the past 6 months.

Our second church plant is outside of Estelí in a community called "Villa Sandino". 30-40 people meet each week and we are still searching for land to purchase to build a church building.

Our third church plant is about 1 and a half hours from Estelí in a remote mountain village called "La Puerta". We purchased land and plan to construct a church building there in the coming year. This remote community has absolutely no gospel preaching church in it and there are about 3,000 people throughout the 5 communities that are all in walking distance to the property we purchased.

Please be in prayer for our seminary which will start again in February. We are praying that more men and women who have received God's call to ministry will join us as we continue to train future pastors and pastor's wives. Also, please continue to pray for our safety and health as well as our residency process. We have submitting all the paperwork to the Nicaraguan Government and are just waiting for approval.

David writes daily devotions and publishes on various social media channels on the subjects of personal purity, and being servants of the Lord. Things that you can pray for us in 2023 are...

Hello Lifepoint Baptist Church! It has been a huge year for us. In May, Vala and I began our first furlough and brought our youngest son back to the States for his first year of college. When we return to Madagascar this December, we will begin to work on our second church plant. As you probably already know, we partnered with another missionary to start our first church plant. In three years we have seen people saved, baptized, and discipled. Vala and I, as well as our missionary partners, have wanted to instill in the DNA of this church to be a reproducing church, so Vala, our Malagasy team, and I are going to lead by example and be sent by our first church to another part of town to begin our second work. In order for this to happen, we needed to train Malagasy workers to take our place in ministry. We are excited to report that those workers have been trained and have been in place since April before we left for furlough and they are doing great. Thank you so much for your support over the last several years. We are excited for what God is going to do in Madagascar this next year.

- Please pray for us as we begin laying the foundation for our second church plant, specifically that we can find a place to begin meeting.
- Please pray for more missionaries. We are asking the Lord to send 7 church planting missionaries in the next 5 years. We are an island about the size of Texas with about 28 million people and very few missionaries. Of those few missionaries, there are only 7 church planting missionary families that we know of. In the last 4 years we have seen more missionaries leave than come to Madagascar.
- This year we will have to renew our visas to stay in country. Please pray for everything to go smoothly and possibly a way for us to get visas longer than 2 years.

Hello Lifepoint! By the grace of our Lord Jesus Christ, we have been ministering to our urban (by American standards) community in Japan since 2017. Within ten miles of where we live there are 1.7 million people, and more than 99% of them have never heard the good news of the person and finished work of Christ for their salvation. We started teaching the Bible to several individuals in 2018, and in Summer 2019 we started having weekly services in our living room. We organized as a church shortly thereafter and continue to meet for weekly church services. We praise God for the obedience to Christ and His Apostles' commands that we have seen among those we are discipling, and we anticipate seeing the many ways in which God continues to shape them more and more into the image of Christ. During the week, we continue to conduct community outreach through teaching English as a Foreign Language and building relationships to gain trust as a means to teach them about Christ from the Bible. We are sent out by Community Baptist Church in The Woodlands, Texas. Our work is focused on helping Community Baptist Church and other partnering churches fulfill the great commission. The main way we do this is by using International Baptist Bible College. The body of students are trained to serve God and start churches. This has proven very productive. We also work with our Ukraine and other country leaders to manage the day to day details and admin. We will move the college offices to a better and safer city if needed. Our students have started many churches in Ukraine and a few other nations. We have classes in Poland, Guatemala, Armenia, and are starting in Estonia.

We have several evangelistic goals. We teach and preach in local churches and we have helped distribute many thousands of Russian Gospel of John/Book of Romans combined. We plan to continue to win and train Ukrainians to be more involved in Church Leadership and evangelism. We actively seek to win Ukrainian children and their families to Christ. 


Lifepoint Friends,

We thought we were going to be starting a new church in 2022, but many different circumstances like visa problems and the passing of Anna's mom made that impossible, so we did as much ministry as we were able to do in other ways.

In 2023, we hope to finally start a new church from scratch and to raise the funds to build a building for our previous church plant. God has been providing new deacons and other leaders in the first church plant, which is a big answer to prayer. That means we will be more available to focus on our next ministry. Please pray for...

- Visa renewals in early 2023. We had trouble in 2022 getting visas. The process took much longer than normal, and we were only given 9 months as opposed to the normal 2 to 3 years. The entire visa process is changing this year, so we have no idea what to expect. We will be having a lawyer help us with this this next year.
- Legal work with our "denomination" in Colombia. The government is trying to get us to pay taxes on buildings that we shouldn't be paying taxes on, but we have to go through a whole legal process to resolve the issue. It will be frustrating, time-consuming, and stressful.
- We're tired, but we still believe God wants us to continue our ministry here in Bogotá. We just need to lean on Him and do what he has called us to do with the strength He gives us.

- For wisdom and guidance as we consider where and how to begin a new church plant.






CREATIVE ACCESS

"The rulers, elders and teachers of the law called them in again and commanded them not to speak or teach at all in the name of Jesus." (Acts 4:18)

There are countries where it is not possible for an expatriate (or foreign) missionary to get a visa. There are countries where church activities are greatly restricted and some countries where open evangelism by Christians is completely prohibited. Churches in areas where they have to meet in secret are sometimes referred to as Underground Churches. Some people have been tempted to think these countries – many of which have Islamic governments – are unreachable. While fulfilling the Great Commission in those countries can be challenging, it is not impossible. Closed to missionaries does not mean closed to the gospel, and that's where the phrase "creative access" is utilized. The following missionary families serve in Creative Access Nations around the world and so information about them is sensitive.

The HeartCry Missionary Society began in 1988 in the country of Peru with a desire to aid indigenous or native missionaries so that they might reach their peoples and establish biblical churches among them. Since then, the Lord has expanded the borders to include not only Latin America, but also Africa, Asia, Eurasia, Europe, and the Middle East.

The goal of the ministry is to facilitate the advancement of indigenous missionaries throughout the world. 




